The work continues....

Following the 2019 selection of Seneca Falls as the winner of the \$10 million DRI award in the Finger Lakes region, the SFDC worked alongside State-assigned consultants to move the process forward.

The SFDC piloted a website dedicated to informing the public and applicants about the DRI and its updates (senecafallsdri.com), organized and facilitated public meetings and events related to the DRI, collaborated with interested parties to guide them through the DRI process, and worked to ensure a smooth transition from interest to application. Several SFDC board members were placed on the Local Planning Committee to hep guide the process and recommend project slate selections.



Assisted Businesses Opening in Seneca Falls

Several new businesses reached out to the SFDC to ask for help regarding location options, navigating Zoning, Planning, and Heritage Preservation requirements, funding assistance, and general guidance.


Businesses included Sackett's Table Restaurant and Market; Auburn Party Supply; Elements Salon & Day Spa; and Kabari Wellness.

NYS Canal Staycation Program

The SFDC helped facilitate the selection of Seneca Falls as one of only six launching points along the NYS Canal System for a new "Staycation" recreation program. Through Labor Day weekend, residents and guests were able to rent kayaks at no charge.

The SFDC also worked closely with local historians to create a water tour map that showcased points of interest that once existed beneath the surface...from homes to factories to the original falls of Seneca Falls. With sell-outs every weekend, the program proved successful and brought more visitors to our downtown area.

















Seneca Falls Farmers Market



The Seneca Falls Farmers Market, which is operated by the SFDC, continues to see annual growth in revenues and attendance. From a wide range of vendors to our ability to accept EBT/SNAP and FMNP benefits, we're able to ensure that our community has access to local just-picked fruits and vegetables.

Despite COVID-19 restrictions, the Farmers Market remained open throughout the season and saw steady numbers of participation. All COVID-19 guidelines were followed as mandated by the State of New York and the Farmers Market Federation.

2020 Centennial Ornaments

The SFDC continued to distribute its Limited Edition 2020 ornaments to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the passing of the 19th Amendment. A total of 1,000 ornaments were produced and fewer than 300 remain available. They will continue to be sold online and through downtown businesses, as well as during the 2021 "Ripples of Change" dedication, which will unveil a new ornament design for 2021.





Purple & Gold Flower Initiative

Collaborating with the Seneca Falls Business Association and local community members, the SFDC helped create and promote a town-wide initiative to encourage people to plant purple and gold flowers in honor and celebration of the Women's Rights movement and the 19th Amendment Centennial.

Store owners and residents were also given a list of flowers and plantings that fared well in our region to help facilitate the program.





2020 Fountain Dedication

To celebrate the 19th Amendment Centennial, the SFDC worked in collaboration with the NYS Power Authority, NYS Canal Corporation, and the Town of Seneca Falls to present a fountain dedication that brought a 60-foot fountain (uplit in gold, purple, and white) to our waterway, outside the new home of the National Women's Hall of Fame.

Dignitaries who attended the event included Lt. Governor Kathy Hochul; President & CEO of the NY Power Authority, Gil Quiniones; Coline Jenkins, the great-great granddaughter of Elizabeth Cady Stanton; David Steblein of ITT Goulds, and others. Mynderse Academy senior girls were also in the backdrop on the canal in kayaks to help commemorate the event and promote the NYS Canal Staycation program.





"Ripples of Change" Sculpture


Working closely with the Women's Suffrage Centennial Commission, the SFDC continues to cultivate a \$270,000+ project that will end with the unveiling of a new statue in Seneca Falls. Titled "Ripples of Change" and designed by renowned sculptor Jane DeDecker, the sculpture will depict four activists whose work spanned generations, including Laura Cornelius Kellogg, Harriet Tubman, Martha Coffin Wright, and Sojourner Truth. The initial home of this large sculpture will be along East Bayard Street, across from Generations Bank Headquarters, with the intention to move it to People's Park via the DRI.

The SFDC Board Chair, Joell Murney-Karsten, was also interviewed for the feature.






Additional Town "Welcome" Signage
